

## Appendix C: Other Fish in Marsh Creek

### Common Carp:

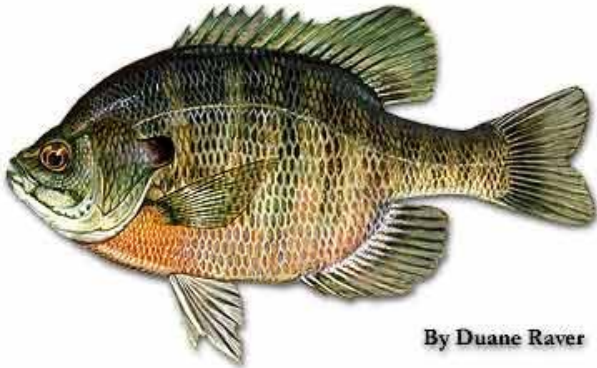

**Length:** usually between 12-25 inches.

**Description:** Body color is brassy green on top grading to bronze or gold on sides.

### Bluegill:

### Young Bluegill:

**Length:** 77mm (approx. 3 inches)

**Description:** oval-shaped body, lavender and bronze with about six dark bars on sides

### Striped Bass:

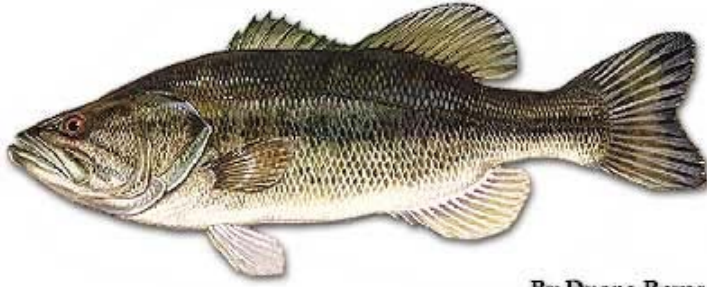

**Length:** 7 inches

**Description:** Elongate, moderately compressed; back olive-green to dark blue, sides silvery, belly white; upper sides with 6-9 dark, uninterrupted stripes.

### **Largemouth Black Bass:**

**Length:** Males seldom exceed 16 inches, females often surpass 22 inches.

**Description:** The largemouth is the largest member of the sunfish family. It generally has light greenish to brownish sides with a dark lateral line which tends to break into blotches towards the tail.

### **Smallmouth Black Bass:**

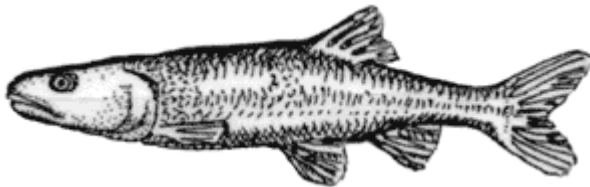

**Length:** Adults are 9 to 10 inches in length.

**Description:** Three dark bars run from the snout, past the gill flap. It has green/brown sides with vertical stripes. The fish can camouflage themselves by changing color according to their environment.

### **Juvenile Squawfish:**



**Length:** 100mm (approx. 4 inches)

**Description:** Elongate, slightly compressed body; back dark olive-brown; sides silvery-grayish; young have dark caudal spot. ([www.eNature.com](http://www.eNature.com))

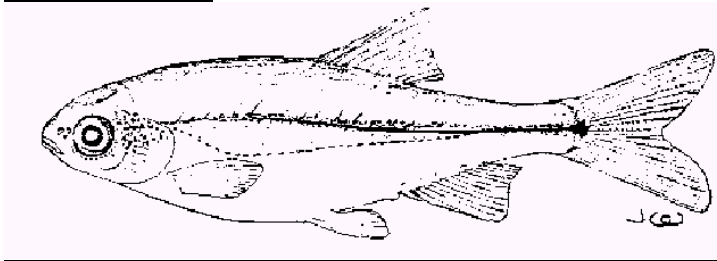
### **California Roach:**



**Length:** 55mm (approx. 2 inches)

**Description:** The body of a typical roach is elongate and rounded in cross section. The head is relatively large and conical. The mouth is small and subterminal. Coloration is grey-steel blue dorsally and dull silver ventrally (Brown et al. 1992) ([www.dfg.ca.gov](http://www.dfg.ca.gov)).

### **Juvenile Hitch:**

**Length:** 63 mm (approx. 2.5 inches)

**Description:** Young fish are silver and have a dark, triangular blotch on the caudal peduncle extending anteriorly as a black stripe that gradually fades (Hopkirk 1973). As fish age, they become duller in color, with the dorsal area turning brownish-yellow (Moyle 1976). ([www.dfg.ca.gov](http://www.dfg.ca.gov))
